The Bylaws of the Belmont Media Center give the School Committee the authority to appoint one of the 9 seats that comprise the BMC Board of Directors. Board appointments are for three years, with a term limit of 2 terms (not to include the shorter terms of the initial Board's members, as the Board established itself and an appointment rotation.)

Myron Kassaraba is one of the founding Board Members and has been the School Committee's appointee since the Board of Conveners established the Belmont Media Center. Responsibilities

The Board of Directors of the Corporation ("Board"), an independent non profit entity, will manage the Corporation's (BCMC) resources for use by Belmont residents, school groups, nonprofit Belmont organizations, local government, and members of the BCMC and execute the Media Center's management contract with the Town. The Board shall lead the organization with vision and an understanding of what is needed to assure the long-term viability and growth of the Corporation. The Board is responsible to manage the affairs and property of the Corporation conferred on them per the contract with the Town. The Board of Directors must uphold the provisions of the By-Laws and protect the financial well being of the Corporation. The Board will provide 'strategic direction' to the Executive Director and his operational staff.

The Board members have a fiduciary responsibility for providing oversight of the Operations and are representatives of the Town residents. Board members do not need to have a cable and broadcast industry background, skills and experience outside of the industry are highly valued by the Board. The Board members are responsible for developing and managing the strategic vision of the Corporation, guiding BCMC, its staff, and membership to develop and deliver quality program content and informative services to the Town.

The Board of Directors consists of 9 seats:

- 3 of the board seats are elected by the general membership,
- 4 of the board seats are appointed by the Board
- 2 of the board seats are appointed by the Town
 - o 1 by the Selectmen
 - 1 by the School Committee
