The report should include research with examples from other districts, input from existing and potential community partners, with recommendations on the models most likely to succeed in Belmont. The report should be presented to the School Committee no later than October 2011.

The School Committee members discussed plans to recruit members for the task force before the end of May, so that work can commence during the summer.
