K-2 Reading Specialists

The Literacy Corner

ABC's

Learning the alphabet is one of the first literacy related activities children do. When children are very young, they learn to sing the Alphabet Song. While it is important that children know the letters in order, they should also be able to recognize upper and lower case letters in isolation and learn their sounds. There are lots of ways to help your child to build automaticity with this.

-Read alphabet books.

-Rainbow letters: Write the letters of the alphabet and have your child trace while saying the name/sound.

-Make your own ABC book: Write each letter on one page and illustrate with things that begin with that letter.

Becoming a Reader

There are many ways you can help at home as your child transitions into a reader. Read aloud daily. As you read, point under the words. Talk about the letters and the sounds they make. Notice sight words and invite your child to read along. Remember that it's OK if they are reading from memory or using the pictures!

Reading and writing are interconnected. Provide a place to write with writing supplies available. Adding in new materials from time to time can be great motivation! Talk with your child often and ask questions that don't have a simple or obvious answer. Discuss the meanings of words. Model a love for reading and writing!

S.M.A.R.T.

To develop basic balance and vestibular skills, try the following activity:

Helicopter Spins

Have your child place his/her arms out straight from their shoulders like a "T" and tilt his/her head down to look at their feet (approx. 30 degree tilt)

Spin for approx. 15 seconds with their eyes closed then stop and stand for 15 seconds with their eyes closed.

-Repeat this start and stop sequence 10 times for a total of 5 minutes. Have Fun!

Book of the Month Blackout By John Rocco

These Autumn days are beautiful, but busy! Families are running from soccer practice to ballet, rushing home to make dinner and have a bath and before you know it, bedtime! Read this book and think about the message. <u>Blackout</u> has little text, but **lots** of meaning. Let's try to unplug, unwind
